



COVID-19 PROTOCOLS

We Out Here Festival 2021 Ticket-Holders

We are looking forward to welcoming you on-site in just a few days, for a well overdue family gathering. Your safety and wellbeing have always been a top priority for us, and in light of the ongoing risks posed by coronavirus (COVID-19), we have developed the below entrance guidelines to keep you, and everyone around you, safe.

Please take the time to read and follow these guidelines, regardless of your vaccination or COVID pass status, so that we can build and maintain a safe environment for all to attend and enjoy.

PRE-FESTIVAL TESTING

Lateral Flow Testing - **Essential for entry**

All ticketholders 15 years old and above will need to take an NHS Lateral Flow COVID-19 self-test within 48 hours of your first-time arrival on site and provide proof of a negative result for entrance to the festival.

You can pick up free tests from [pharmacies and collection points near you](#) or online via the [NHS website](#).

PLEASE DO YOUR TEST WITHIN 48 HOURS OF TRAVELLING TO WE OUT HERE

Once you have taken a lateral flow test, you must log into <https://www.gov.uk/report-covid19-result> and report your result through the QR code on the test strip.

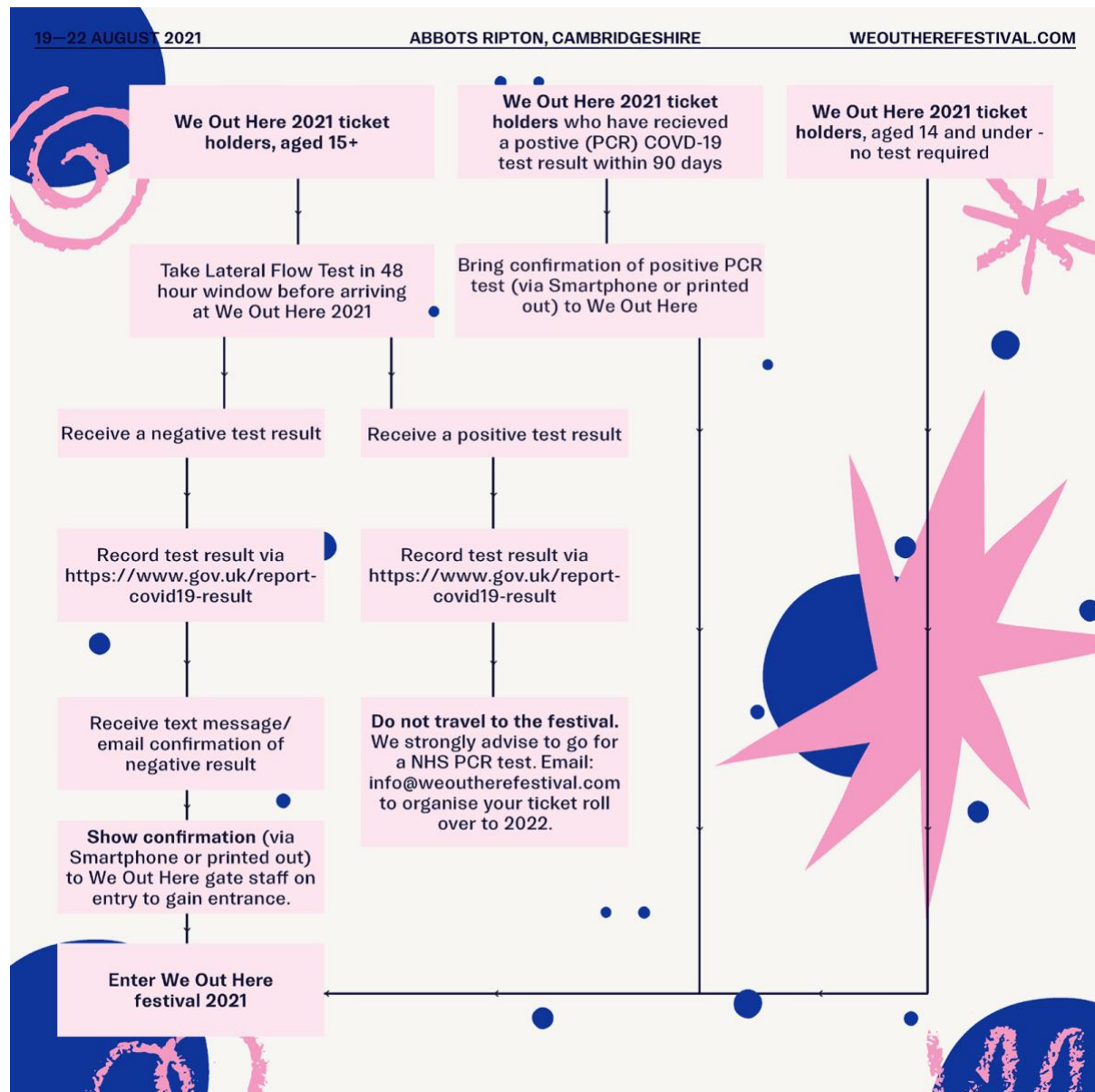


After logging your result, you will receive a text message or email which will confirm your result.

If you have a **negative** result, please arrive on site with this confirmation ready at the gate along with your festival ticket.

You will need to show the text message or email confirmation on your smart phone to a member of the We Out Here team on arrival. Alternatively, you can bring a printout of the confirmation.

If you have a **positive** COVID result please contact us on info@weoutherefestival.com to let us know, and we can organise a ticket rollover for We Out Here 2022.



Re-entrance policy:

- Once you upload your test results, your negative Lateral Flow Test confirmation (text or email) will be valid for festival entry for 48 hours.
- If you are re-entering the festival site, you will need to ensure you have valid certification.
- You may need to do an additional test if your confirmation expires past 48 hours.

Exceptions

- Anyone who has received a positive (PCR) COVID-19 test result should not take a LFT within 90 days of that test unless they develop any new symptoms of COVID-19. Please show the confirmation of a positive PCR test within the last 90 days (*Please note: if you have received a positive PCR test within the last 10 days, you should not travel to the festival*).
- Those without a smartphone and so unable to show the confirmation of the online LFT reporting can show a negative test cartridge, at the entrance gate.
- Those arriving without a way of showing confirmation of a negative Lateral Flow COVID-19 test, will be asked to visit the COVID testing area to have a test carried out. **This will significantly delay the time it takes for you to enter the site. The cost of this is £6 per test.**

If any of the below apply to you, you should not come to site.

Please follow government guidelines.

- ✗ A positive test within 10 days of your arrival
- ✗ Experiencing any symptoms within 10 days of your arrival
- ✗ A member of your household testing positive or displaying symptoms within 14 days of your arrival
- ✗ Requirement for you to self-isolate

If you experience symptoms whilst on-site, you will be advised to leave the event, to self-isolate and take a PCR test.

If you do experience any of the above, we will happily roll over your booking to 2022.

Symptoms

- A high temperature: this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back.
- A new continuous cough: this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours
- A loss or a change to your sense of smell or taste: this means you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal.

FESTIVAL GUIDANCE

On-site guidance to reduce risk of transmission

We Out Here festival takes place almost entirely outdoors, which is one of the best Covid-safe practices to implement.

We also will be operating further measures to reduce the risk of COVID-19 including:

- Increased ventilation through all tents/structures
- Face masks for all “customer facing” staff on site
- Mandatory face mask wearing for all within closed sided tents (such as the cinema tent).
- A designated socially distanced area at the main stage arena.
- Increased hand washing and sanitisation points throughout the site

We ask for respect, patience and empathy for how those around us feel. We all have a responsibility to do what we can and your commitment to following these guidelines is a small gesture to those more vulnerable or uncertain in these times.
